\*Registration must be paid in full between 16 April and 7 May 2021 to receive the US\$49 rate.

Registration is also now open for the Rotaract, Youth Exchange Officer and Inter-Country Committee preconventions, which will be held 10-11 June 2021. The cost of each pre-convention event is US\$20.

Cancellations and refunds for registrations or associated events will be accepted through 11:59:59 p.m. CDT, 31 May. The cancellation fee is 20% of the registrant's total fees paid. No refunds will be given after 31 May.

Details on drafting and submitting resolutions can be found in How to Propose Resolutions. Rotary must receive any proposed resolutions from Clubs no later than **30 June 2021** using the online form [here](#)."*

If your Club is interested in submitting a resolution, please see the link above ("How to Propose Resolutions") and review the online form. This form must be used to submit a proposal for consideration.

Please note the Council on Resolutions will not consider resolutions proposed by **CLUBS** unless they are endorsed by the district and confirmed by the district governor.
